CHAPTER

AN ORDINANCE IN AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 19 OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF EAST PROVIDENCE, RHODE ISLAND 1998, AS AMENDED, ENTITLED "ZONING"

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EAST PROVIDENCE HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION I. Section 19-95 entitled "Districts Designated" of Article III entitled "District Regulations" is hereby amended as follows:

Parcel 12 on Assessor's Map 308, Block 09 presently located in the R-4, Residential 4 One-Family and Two-Family District is hereby changed to the C-3, General Retail Business District, but tattoo parlors and check cashing businesses shall be prohibited uses in perpetuity.

The Zoning Map of the City of East Providence shall be amended accordingly.

- **SECTION II.** The petitioner shall be relieved from the literal requirements of the East Providence Zoning Ordinance by reducing the front yard building setback from 7.5 feet to 0 feet for Parcel 012 on Assessor's Map 308, Block 09.
- **SECTION III.** The petitioner shall be relieved from the literal requirements of the East Providence Zoning Ordinance by reducing the rear yard building setback from 30 feet to 4 feet for Parcel 012 on Assessor's Map 308, Block 09.
- **SECTION IV.** The petitioner shall be relieved from the literal requirements of the East Providence Zoning Ordinance by reducing the buffer strip between more intensive that abut less intensive uses from 25 feet to 0 feet for Parcel 012 on Assessor's Map 308, Block 09.
- **SECTION V.** The petitioner shall be relieved from the literal requirements of the East Providence Zoning Ordinance by reducing the space between the building's walls and the wall of another building from 40 feet to 38 feet for Parcel 012 on Assessor's Map 308, Block 09.
- **SECTION VI.** The petitioner shall be relieved from the literal requirements of the East Providence Zoning Ordinance by reducing the buffer strip of vegetation around the site from 5 feet to 0 feet for Parcel 012 on Assessor's Map 308, Block 09.
- **SECTION VII.** The petitioner shall be relieved from the literal requirements of the East Providence Zoning Ordinance by reducing the separation between the parking area and the public right-of-way from 5 feet to 0 feet for Parcel 012 on Assessor's Map 308, Block 09.

SECTION VIII. The petitioner shall be relieved from the literal requirements of the East Providence Zoning Ordinance by increasing the maximum impermeable surface coverage from 80 percent to 86 percent for Parcel 012 on Assessor's Map 308, Block 09.

SECTION IX. The petitioner shall be relieved from the literal requirements of the East Providence Zoning Ordinance by reducing the off-street loading spaces from one to zero for Parcel 012 on Assessor's Map 308, Block 09.

SECTION X. The petitioner shall be relieved from the literal requirements of the East Providence Zoning Ordinance by reducing the required parking spaces from 39 spaces to 28 spaces for Parcel 012 on Assessor's Map 308, Block 09.

SECTION XI. Bank ATM is an allowed use on Parcel 012 on Assessor's Map 308, Block 09.

SECTION XII. This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and all ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
