Historic & Cultural Resources

- List and describe resources
- Are there current or potential future threats to significant resources?
- What are existing local programs, policies, City committees, and/or community groups that manage these resources?

City Services & Infrastructure

- Does current capacity meet existing population needs?
- Will future development impact level of service?
- Do services/infrastructure need to be expanded, upgraded, etc.?

Solid waste management/recycling, drinking water, sewer, school facilities, libraries, community/senior center, public safety

Management, Protection, & Awareness

Historic District Commission

- Designates individual properties or a concentration of properties as local historic districts
- Issues certification of appropriateness for any construction, alteration, repair, removal or demolition affecting the exterior appearance of a structure within a local historic district

- Hunt's Mill Historic District
- Rumford Historic District



Carousel Commission

- Establishes programs for the preservation, restoration, and operation of the Crescent Park Carousel
- Undertakes fundraising activities necessary to finance such programs.

Assets & Opportunities

Challenges

Historic and cultural assets are not accessible by walking or biking

Limited places to experience the arts

Some feel the City is losing its historic places

Sustaining resources for upkeep and upgrade of infrastructure (water, sewer, roads, sidewalks)

Continued investment in school facilities and public education

Providing services for disadvantages residents (low income, with disabilities, veterans, etc.)

Rising costs of services to residents, including taxes, fees, etc.








City Services and Infrastructure

Invest in Long-term Maintenance and Upgrades of Facilities and Infrastructure

Buildings and facilities, roads and sidewalks, water and sewer, stormwater, parks and playgrounds

- Develop/maintain regular scheduled programs of maintenance and upgrades of facilities, equipment, amenities
- ---> Identify long-term funding sources
- ---- Accessibility for people with disabilities

Support Public Safety Needs

Fire, Police, Rescue, Emergency Management

- ---> Ensure adequate staffing
- ---> Maintain vehicle and equipment maintenance and replacement
- Support community-based initiatives and outreach between departments and residents

City Services and Infrastructure

Support the Social Needs of the Community

- Promote inclusion and acceptance, build trust and community
- Promote inter-generational programming and services (recreational activities, social programs, educational activities)
- ----> Continue to strengthen the Public Library, Senior Center, and other core services provided by the City
- Continue programs that improve quality of life of residents, particularly those that support housing security, economic opportunities, and education.
- Maintain connections with organizations in the
 City/region that provide support services for residents
 (EBCAP, Family Services, etc.)








Ensure Transparent Communication and Active Citizen
